

## Direct Object Pronouns

The direct object is who/what is receiving the action in a sentence.

I kick the ball. We write letters. She hit me.

me - \_\_\_\_\_

*Direct Object Pronouns can be placed -*

1. \_\_\_\_\_ a conjugated verb. (1 verb)
  2. \_\_\_\_\_ a negative command.
  3. \_\_\_\_\_ to an infinitive. (2 verbs)
  4. \_\_\_\_\_ to a positive command. \*accent\* (cover it/say it/second to last)
  5. \_\_\_\_\_ to a present participle. \*accent\* (-ándo, -iéndo, -yéndo)
